## **LRC12 – Canvas Paint**

The Canvas Paint, is designed to colour all types of canvas materials, including canvas roof tops.

First, with any canvas material, ensure it is deep cleaned prior to any applications, but very importantly it's 100% dry before this is applied on to the material to paint the canvas, as this can affect the products application and stop it from colouring the canvas material correctly.

For canvas roofs where they are very dirty, it's advised to wet these first with a hose pipe, apply some fabric cleaner to the roof and scrub in with a brush, to get deep into the fibres of the canvas to be cleaned, then hose down once again, repeat this process until your 100% happy with the cleaning process and outcome of the canvas material. For very dirty canvas it possible you may need a TFR to help with the cleaning.

If the canvas has gone mouldy then a mould remover will also be required to clean the canvas material as well as the fabric cleaner.

Before your start to paint on your canvas, make sure the material is 100% dry. Mask up all areas that are not canvas so you don't get this on plastics, painted areas, chrome or glass.

Once you are ready to paint the canvas material, get a metal or plastic mixing pot, a paint brush and medium stiffness brush. Put your canvas paint into the pot and add some water to thin the product down, the first application can be thinner than other coats applied, so the first application is more thin than normal. The purpose of it being thinner is to get into all the fibres and right to the bottom of each fibre that's being painted. Once this coating is dried brush up the canvas to fluff the material once more, then apply a second coating, again brushing the canvas paint onto the material going in all directions possible to make sure you have all fibres painted.

The canvas paint is not designed to change the colour of canvas it's designed to colour what canvas you already have, if the canvas is a light canvas, like a white, or pale colour then yes, it's possible to use the canvas paint to make this a different darker colour/shade.

Once you have painted all your canvas items you can then proceed to waterproof them using a fabric protection spray product. For the application of this follow the instruction of that product making sure it's not affecting the newly painted canvas in any way.
