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LRC14 – Leather Paint Colourants.

The leather paints are designed to colour pigmented leathers or to paint anilines to turn them to pigmented leathers, or for restoring the painted finish on leather items.

The leather repair paint can be used for multiple things, from a simple scuff in a leather item, to colour loss due to fading or colour loss from being sun bleached.

Due to the unique strengths and qualities of these leather repair paints, they are high grade professional products designed to give a tough yet flexible finish to the surface that's the same as when the leather item was tanned originally and made into a leather skin.

Painted Leather, Semi-Aniline Leather, Pigmented Leather, Top Coated Leather, Oil & Wax Pull-Up Leather, Two-Tone, Mottled & Antique Finished Leather, Bicast leather, Vegan leather, Vinyl and faux leather, including bonded leather, can also be used to pigmented paint aniline leather if you wanted to convert an aniline leather item to a painted finish.

Leather repair paint can be used on many items, from fixing small scuff and scratches, to putting colour on bigger areas, or to fully paint a sofa or leather car interior.

As well as fixing minor damaged areas on leather items, these leather colourants can be used to repair or restore colour fading. Fading can happen for many reasons, exposure to light or heat or just general wear and tear with colour coming off the surface creating faded areas on leather items.

The standard range of 28 colours are as follows: White, Strong Black, Yellow Oxide, Dark Blue, Orange, Bright Yellow, Umber, Lemon, Weak Black, Bright Red, Green, Red Oxide, Magenta, Scarlet, Violet, Navy, Cream, Light Grey, Caramel, Dark Grey, Buttermilk, Dark Brown, Maroon, Ivory, Light Blue, Light Beige, Light Tan & Figaro.

But any colour leather can be made from the Leather Colourant Paints, we just need a reasonable sized sample to scan and then let our technicians do the rest it's that simple, they will not only match the colour by a spectrophotometer they will finish this by eye to ensure it is perfect.

How Many Colours Are There?

The leather paints come in a standard range of 28 colours, but we have hundreds of thousands of shades of colours on our data base to pick from, or you can simply send in a sample of colour you require. This can even be a colour card, leather, paper, plastic, or painted metal all we need is a flat surface so we can scan this with the spectrophotometer to get an exact match for you.

Each colour can be mixed together to create even more shades, the limit is endless. By adding a small drop of umber to cream, would create a darker shade of cream, adding white it's going to go lighter, add strong black it's going to make it darker but a grey, tone. The limit to the amount of leather colours you can make is staggering. Yellow and blue create a green, add more black and it goes darker, add more yellow and it becomes brighter, white will lighten it, it's limitless, let your imagination flow.

Application:

Applying the leather repair paints is very simple, once your area has been prepared properly using the leather repair prep solution and you have wiped over the surface with an alcohol cleaner, you can then start your application process.

First of all, it depends what repair job you are doing. If this is just a small colour loss touch up on a leather item, and the damaged area isn't that bad you can just stipple the colour on with light stippling motions not to create a rough finish, nice smooth gentle actions. If the repair is more major and a large area, then we wipe the colour in, this is done in a hap hazard motion just to form a base covering allowing the leather repair paint to soak into the damaged areas, then this is followed with a gentle stippling motion to give an even coverage. Sometimes you need more than two coats due to the type of colour being applied. If you are going to apply with a spray gun, then you start off with applying the colour in a hap hazard fashion, then switch to the spray gun and spray on even coats again two to three coats are required dependant on the colours being used.

Between each coating of paint that's applied it's best to sand very lightly with a 1200 grit paper, you don't need to be heavy handed with this. It's just a light stroking motion to remove any fine particles of dust from within the layers of leather repair paint, this ensures the end result is perfectly smooth ready for the leather clear coat lacquer sealers to be applied.

Leather repair paints are water-based paints, so are easy to apply and store, we advise a shelf life of 12 months for these leather colourants.

Applying The Lacquer

To finish off a project after using the leather repair paints it's advised to set them and seal them in place with a sealing lacquer. The <u>standard lacquer</u> for a standard type of finish is used in most cases. If you wanted a silkier touch for something antique like an antique chesterfield leather sofa, then you can use the <u>antique sealing lacquer</u> for a silky finish.
